COURSE INFORMATION

AIMS

During this 18 week course you will attend college for 10 hours a week. This course will help you develop your awareness and active use of a wide range of grammar structures and vocabulary areas for the Cambridge examination, Certificate in Advanced English (level 6 / CEF C1). The language skills of listening, speaking, writing and reading will also be covered to this level. The general level of the class will be Advanced.

QUALIFICATIONS

During this 18 week course you will attend college for 17 hours a week. You will work towards achieving the Cambridge Advanced English exam, and Edinburgh College [EC] units.

COURSE CONTENT

You will work with the whole class, individually and in pairs and small groups. Your teacher will expect you to participate in all class activities by contributing opinions and ideas and by listening to others. You will be encouraged to develop independent learning skills and sometimes you will be asked to work independently within the hours of the course timetable. You are required to buy **both** a course book **and** a workbook. Your teacher will offer advice on working independently and will also suggest suitable materials for independent study. There will be materials (often through links) available for you to use on Moodle. Learner independence is an expectation at this level.

TUTORIALS

Your main teacher will also be your class tutor. You will speak to your tutor individually to agree an individual learning plan (ILP) for you, and at regular times in the course to discuss your progress.

ASSESSMENT AND PROGRESSION

The course will include two mock CAE exams, regular unit reviews and progress tests to help you measure your progress and identify areas which need further self-study. In order to achieve the objectives of the CAE course and to get a College certificate, you must:

- complete all the progress tests
- complete homework tasks
- come to 80% of your classes

If you are successful at CAE level you may progress to:

- Other college courses or university if you achieve the required score in your IELTS test.
- employment

There will not be classes on the days of the exams.
