



# FURTHER EDUCATION BURSARY PARENTALLY SUPPORTED STUDENTS UNDER 25

**Funding is subject to certain qualifying criteria as defined by the Scottish Government including residence requirements and household income.**

**If you have previously received bursary support or have an advanced level qualification you may initially be refused funding. There is a right of appeal.**

**Students who are 18 to 24 on the start date of the course** are required to submit details of parental income. Please note Edinburgh College currently awards an EMA of £30 a week rather than bursary maintenance allowances to full-time students who are living in the parental home and who are 19 or under throughout their programme of study. These students are also considered for travel and study expenses from the bursary fund assessed against parental income.

**Students not living with parents** - Some full-time students such as those without parental support or who live out with a reasonable daily travelling distance of the college may receive additional support from the Further Education Bursary fund, depending on age and circumstances, e.g. the higher rate of maintenance of £104.65 a week.

**\*Students under 25 and applying for self-supporting student status (exemption from parental income)** are required to submit proof of spouse/partner income if applicable. Students must submit the relevant proof to confirm self-support, such as P60s, covering a full three years of their own income which must be sufficient and exclude periods spent in full-time education.

**20-24 parentally dependant** – Standard weekly maintenance award £82.81.

Up to £24,274	£82.81
£30,000	£66.97
£40,000	£41.13
