FURTHER EDUCATION BURSARY – STUDENTS 25 AND OVER



Funding is subject to certain qualifying criteria as defined by the Scottish Government including residence requirements and household income.

If you have previously received bursary support or have an advanced level qualification you may initially be refused funding. There is a right of appeal. In addition to giving details of their own income applicants are required to submit proof of spouse/partner income, if applicable.

The maximum weekly maintenance award is £108.55. Please see the table below to see how income affects the level of the award. Students eligible for benefits while attending college may not qualify for maintenance allowances. Those continuing on Universal Credit may receive a maximum of £28 a week.

The bursary also covers allowances towards travel expenses (if living beyond a two mile radius "as the crow flies" from the campus attended) and essential study expenses such as books and equipment as specified by the department running your course.
